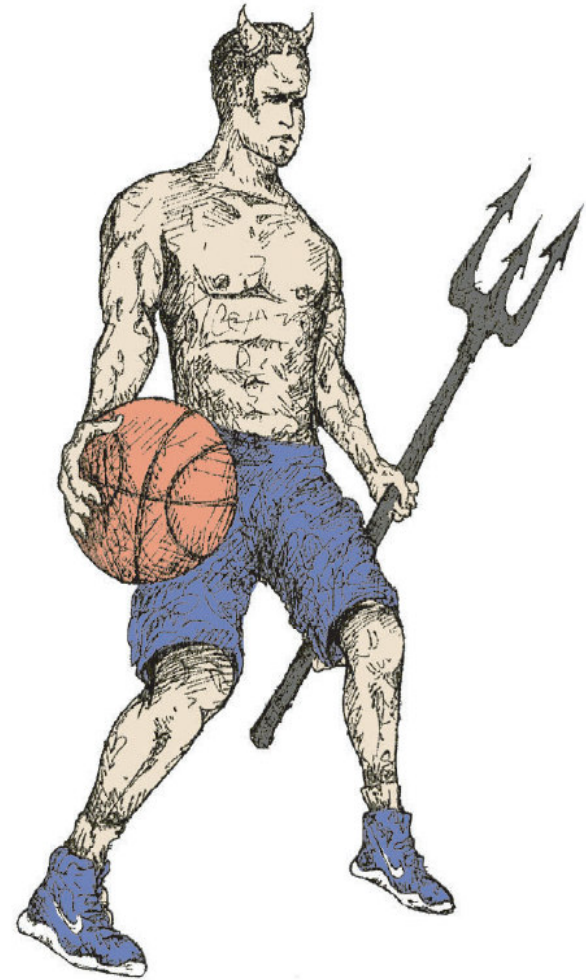

### Key Milestones in Basketball History

- 1847 – Backboard first used
- 1914 – Bottom of net is opened
- 1922 – Running with ball is a violation, not a foul
- 1924 – Person fouled is awarded a free throw
- 1938 – No center jump ball after each made basket
- 1945 – Unlimited player substitution is allowed
- 1945 – Defensive goal tending is banned
- 1987 – 3pt line is introduced
